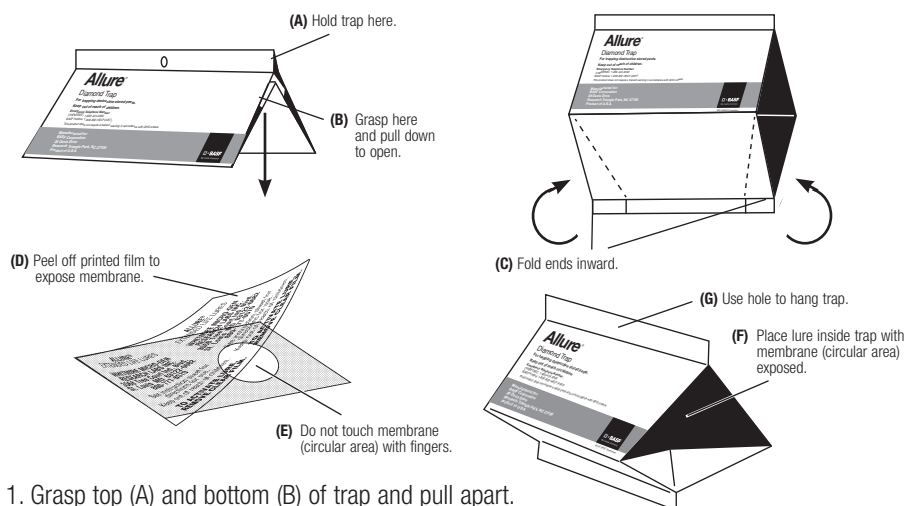

Allure[®] Diamond Trap Assembly Instructions:



1. Grasp top (A) and bottom (B) of trap and pull apart.
